Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT’S RIGHT TO CANCEL

We are aligned for your success and support your every step, but we understand in some cases you may not be able to continue or want to withdraw from Lambda School.

You may withdraw from a program without owing any tuition or penalty before the last class of Sprint 5. If you withdraw or are withdrawn between the end of Sprint 5 (for all programs) and the end of Sprint 22 for Enterprise Backend, you will be responsible for a pro-rata portion of your tuition and receive a refund for applicable amounts paid in advance. If you withdraw or are withdrawn after you complete Sprint 22 for Enterprise Backend, you will be responsible for 100% of your tuition. See the chart on the next page for more information

Failure to make required tuition payments, on any plan, may result in academic suspension and/or withdrawal.

LAMBDA SCHOOL’S RIGHT TO WITHDRAW OR TERMINATE

Lambda School can terminate your enrollment or withdraw you at any time for failure to comply with policies in the Student Guide and generally, including for lack of attendance.

Note: Students may miss no more than eight hours of class per month. If you are withdrawn from Lambda School, the tuition proration policy will apply based on when you are withdrawn. Note that depending on the reason for withdrawal, you may not be eligible for re-admission.

HOW TO WITHDRAW FROM THE PROGRAM AND CANCEL YOUR ENROLLMENT

You can withdraw by contacting the Student Success team via Slack at /frontdesk or by email to cancel@lambdaschool.com, effective the day of the clear message requesting withdrawal.

TUITION PRORATION FOR TUITION OWED AFTER WITHDRAWAL

(For Enterprise Backend Development students) If you withdraw or are withdrawn prior to the end of the fifth week (fifth sprint), the amount you will owe is \$0. If you withdraw or are withdrawn on or after the last day of the fifth week (fifth sprint) and prior to the last day of the 22nd week (22nd sprint) we will calculate the amount of tuition owed to be no more than as follows: The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, divided by the number of days in the program), multiplied by the number of days you attended, or were scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal. The daily charge for Lambda School is \$167.00 a day. This is calculated by dividing the \$30,000 tuition by the number of days in the full-time program (180 days). After the last day of the 22nd week (22nd sprint) when over 60% of the program has been completed, the full amount of tuition is due.

Please note, there is no additional cost for participating in our Flex program, so repeated sprints from Flex are not counted twice.

CALIFORNIA NOTICE REGARDING CANCELLATION TIMING

Last date of cancellation with any tuition proration: **[COMPLETION OF SPRINT 22]** (22 weeks for Backend from start date) or scheduled completion of Sprint 22 for the Enterprise Backend program, whatever comes later.

HOW REFUNDS WORK

Within 45 days, amounts due to you per the chart above will either be refunded directly to you if prepaid or, for your Retail Installment Contract, communicated to your servicer for adjustment to your balance owed.

If any portion of the tuition was paid from the proceeds of a loan or by a third party, any applicable refund shall be sent to the lender, third party or, if appropriate, to the state or federal agency that guaranteed or reinsured the loan.

If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

FOR STUDENTS WHO OBTAIN OUTSIDE LOANS OR USE OTHER PAYMENT OPTIONS

If you are eligible for a loan guaranteed by the federal or state government and you default on the loan, both of the following may occur:

1. The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against the student, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan.
2. The student may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government assistance until the loan is repaid.

If you obtain a loan from a third party to enable you to pay tuition, you will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus any interest, less the amount of any refund. If you default on such third party loans, your loan provider and/or loan guarantee agency may take action against you and that is not action on behalf of Lambda School.

You may have the opportunity to participate in third-party programs or sponsorships, or Lambda School offerings that contribute to or allow for payment of your tuition. These may involve their own

obligations. You are solely responsible for any agreement you enter into and understand these agreements may have other conditions or terms, including for which Lambda School is not responsible.
